What is Rehabilitation Counseling?

Rehabilitation counseling is a systematic process which assists persons with physical, mental, developmental, cognitive, and emotional disabilities to achieve their personal, career, and independent living goals in the most integrated setting possible through the application of the counseling process. The counseling process involves communication, goal setting, and beneficial growth or change through self-advocacy, psychological, vocational, social, and behavioral interventions.

The MA Curriculum

The 54-credit hour Master of Arts (MA) degree program in Rehabilitation Counseling is comprised of coursework that addresses the foundations of the rehabilitation counseling profession, counseling theories and techniques, medical, psychological, and social aspects of disability, assessment, and the career development and employment of people with disabilities.

In addition to on-campus coursework and community-based practicum and internship experiences, MA Rehabilitation Counseling students have the opportunity to attend professional rehabilitation conferences, gain exposure to and become integrated into a broad network of rehabilitation and counseling professionals, and receive mentoring through our program Student Rehabilitation Association (SRA).

Employment Opportunities

Program graduates obtain professional positions in a wide variety of employment settings including non-profit rehabilitation programs, state rehabilitation agencies, private rehabilitation/workers compensation programs, high schools and colleges, independent living centers, medical rehabilitation centers, substance abuse treatment programs, and corrections facilities.

Professional Credentials

Graduates are eligible for national certification as a rehabilitation counselor (CRC) and licensure as a professional counselor (LPC) in the state of Michigan.

Financial Support

The MA Rehabilitation Counseling program provides financial support to students through a federal Rehabilitation Services Administration, U.S. Department of Education, rehabilitation counseling training grant and through paid internship opportunities. Program students also identify sources of financial assistance via full or part-time employment in rehabilitation agencies and MSU-based scholarships, fellowships, and student loans.

Admission

Students are admitted for Fall Semester of each year. Applications are accepted through February 15 of the year in which admission is desired, or until available openings are filled.

Consideration is given to the applicant's previous academic and professional experience. There should be in each applicant's background a pattern of experience that supports his or her expressed desire to pursue advanced graduate studies in rehabilitation counseling. Appropriate evidence of such experience should be reflected in the applicant's letters of recommendation. The following are factors significant in determining ultimate acceptance as a candidate:

1. A bachelor's degree in an appropriate field from an accredited institution, with a grade point average of 3.00 (B) or better in the last two years of undergraduate study.
2. A written statement of academic goals and career objectives that is 1-2 pages single-spaced, typed in length and describes the applicant's professional goals as they relate to the MA program in Rehabilitation Counseling.
3. Three letters of recommendation, with at least two from professors and/or employers.
4. Scores from the Graduate Record Examination General Test if the applicant's grade point average is below 3.00.
